Book Of Remembrance

PROCEEDS of a tag day on Saturday next will be used to establish a Book of Remembrance containing the names of every man and woman in Halifax City and County whose lives were given in the common cause in World War II or the Korean War. Appropriately, this Book of Remembrance is to be arranged by the Halifax County Chapter of the Silver Cross Women of Canada. That is an organization of women who lost sons or daughters in World Wars I or II.

The Silver Cross Women feel that Haligonians generally would like to share in this Book of Remembrance and the tag day will give everyone an opportunity to have a direct part in this dignified and fitting tribute to our war dead.

The new library promises to be a building of which Halifax people may be proud. But let us not forget that we have erected it as a "memorial" library and it is altogether appropriate that it should contain a record of those who gave their lives in two struggles against aggression. The library itself is a notable monument to their memory but it will be the more so if it enshrines within its walls this Book of Remembrance which the Silver Cross Women are undertaking to provide.
